### **GENERAL WORK SESSION...**

On the motion of Mr. McLaughlin and seconded by Mr. McComb, the Board unanimously approved to enter the General Work Session with Pocahontas County Board of Education.

#### **A. Review of Re-Entry Plan**

- Green Bank Elementary-Middle School entered full remote learning until November 16, 2020. Deep cleaning will continue.
- If school is shut down, not practice is permitted.
- Basketball season may continue following State, County, and WVSSAC guidelines.
- School bus transportation will be utilized whenever possible.
- Two tickets per athlete per game for both home and visiting teams.
- Media restricted to two individuals per team.
- Temperature scans will be monitored with athletes and all spectators.
- Concession sales will be at the discretion of the individual school.
- Students will return to 4-day instruction within the school buildings beginning November 05, 2020.
- Should Pocahontas County enter Red Zone on the State map, students will remote learn and staff will work in in their respective buildings.

#### **B. Discussion of the Slaven Property**

- Pressure is coming from the County Commission and the Greenbrier Economic Development for the Board to give the property back to the Commission.
- Dr. Hollandsworth never discussed the probability to give it back to the Commission.

- Mrs. Radcliff contacted Mr. Larry Barr, a surveyor in the county, to perform a survey and appraisal of said property—estimated cost of \$3,000-\$5,000.
- A separate survey will be included for the Pocahontas County Solid Waste Authority for the Green Bank area.
- It was discussed to sell the entire parcel instead of subdividing the land.
- Board is in favor of the public auction and defining the minimum bid to include the costs that are being incurred with the survey and appraisal.
- Proceeds may be earmarked as infrastructure.

**C. Update on the 2021-2022 Personnel Concerns**

- Retirements may not be immediately posted.
- Reconfiguration of class size may deem necessary.
- With the budgeting constraints, positions may need realigned.
- Mrs. Radcliff presented the Professional and Service Financial Analysis.

**D. Review of the 2020-2030 CEFPP**

- Request larger amount of money for MIP.
- Order of importance may be the sprinkler system at MES, roof at MES, lighting at all schools, plumbing and boilers.
- Mr. Hall proposes that if we are going to keep all five schools open, then repairs must be done in all five schools to make them operational.
- Discussion to run a levy in two years was projected.
- Time to plan is now.
