Call Meeting to Order.

Open with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**AGENDA...**

On the motion of Mr. Burns and seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board unanimously approved the agenda with the following changes: striking the last 6 bullets from page 11, the Child Nutrition portion of the Re-Entry Plan, pulling the Teacher of Agriculture, inserting three additional names under the substitute service personnel and pulling the resignation of Rebecca Peteete. Mr. McLaughlin requested an Executive Session concerning personnel issues to be held after Matters of the Board, no action taken.

**DELEGATIONS ...**

- a. Mr. Dane Sizemore, Effective Communication. Mr. Sizemore asked the Board to consider expert advice from the CDC, United States military, and the specialists on implementing mask mandates for safety.
- b. Mr. Joshua Hardy, Covid-19 Safety (ZOOM). Mr. Hardy recommended the Board consider mask mandates for the elementary and middle schools, both students and staff, in order to adequately protect those under 12 years of age.
- c. Mrs. Nichole Rose-Taylor, Mask Mandate. Mrs. Rose-Taylor encouraged the Board to consider supporting individual choice when implementing the mask mandate. An informal survey, created by local parents surfaced on social media, 325 were in support of individual choice while 36 asked for the mask mandate.
- d. Mr. Sherman Taylor, Mask Mandate (ZOOM). Mr. Taylor acclaimed the Board to protect our core foundation, our freedoms and end the mask mandate.
- e. Mrs. Maria Hall, Mask Mandate. Mrs. Hall reiterated protecting our constitutional rights with supporting personal, parental choice on the mask mandate. "My body, my choice."
- f. Ms. Teresa Mullen, Mask Mandate. Ms. Mullen agreed the Board should consider employing the right to choose for one and all with the mask mandate.

- g. Mrs. Anita Workman, Mask Mandate. Mrs. Workman recommend the Board uphold our American freedoms and encourage choice for the mask mandate.
- h. Mrs. Jan Jonese, Mask Mandate. Mrs. Jonese expressed her belief to be that masks should be a choice instead of mandated by the Board.
- i. Mrs. Kristine Sharp, Mask Mandate. Mrs. Sharp, wife of a veteran, indicated that the Board should respect our freedom of choice when considering the mask mandate.
- j. Mrs. Rachel Fanning, Mask Mandate (ZOOM). Mrs. Fanning asked the Board to consider mandating the masks in order to protect our students.
- k. Mr. Derek Trull, Mask Mandate (ZOOM). Mr. Trull recommended considering scientific data based on medicine and knowledge by mandating the masks. We can protect or system by masking up.
- l. Mrs. Kari Cooper, PMH Pharmacy Director and Dr. Matthew Lee, Mask Mandate. Representing Pocahontas Memorial Hospital, Mrs. Cooper and Dr. Lee lectured the Board in favor of enforcing the mask mandate. The virus is coming and we are not where we need to be in the county with vaccination rates. Masks will protect the community.
- m. Mr. Justin Taylor, Mask Mandate. Mr. Taylor is tired of being stripped of his freedoms. He requested the Board to vote individual choice and not attempt to mandate out of fear.
- n. Mrs. Shannon Alderman, Mask Mandate. Mrs. Alderman approached the Board in support of parental choice. Even the state has not encouraged the mask mandate at the present time.
- o. Mrs. Terrell McSweeny and daughter Madalin Burns, Mask Mandate (ZOOM). Mrs. McSweeny and daughter Madalin encouraged the Board to listen to the experts. Masks should be mandated.
- p. Mr. John Paul Burks, Mask Mandate. Mr. Burks read a letter on behalf of his high school student, Hannah Burks, who indicated the Board should not infringe upon her personal freedoms, her right to choose. Let masks be an option.
- q. Mrs. Jessica Hefner, Mask Mandate. Mrs. Hefner declared being completely against the masks. She probed the Board to allow children to build a hearty immune system and continue to release the mask mandate.
- r. Luci Mosesso, Re-Entry Plans (ZOOM). Mrs. Mosesso asked the Board to make additional considerations when voting on the Re-Entry Plan, ex. settling the inconsistencies, defining the Excessive Heat Policy, being more tolerant of truancy issues, and informing parents when a positive case is in the classroom.
- s. Dr. Jennifer Beverage, Mask Mandate. Dr. Beverage, board certified Family Physician and veteran, addressed the Board with illness statistics in children. CDC recommends frequent handwashing protocols. The masks provided are not protecting our students—they do not seal.
- t. Lori Wayne, representing Brandy Wayne—President of GBEM LSIC. Mrs. Wayne wanted to thank the Board, Mr. Beam, and Mr. Hall for getting the heating system fixed at Green Bank Elementary-Middle School, for the new roof application, and for the upcoming installation of the

air conditioning. We appreciate the Board listening to the concerns of the LSIC, the recent upgrades, and keeping Green Bank where it needs to be. Thank you.

### **SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT & SPECIAL RECOGNITION...**

Mr. Beam welcomed Shana Alderman as the new principal at Green Bank Elementary-Middle School. She is from Raleigh County.

Mr. Beam reminded staff that the first day of school is Thursday, August 12, 2021. Staff will be working in their respective schools. Friday, August 13<sup>th</sup>, staff will meet at the high school at 8:00 am for training. Board members are welcome to attend.

Mr. Beam clarified that we would be returning to the SBA this fall to request funding for air conditioning for schools not covered in the American Rescue Plan money. Though some schools have HVAC lower on the improvement needs list, in speaking with Ben Ashley of the SBA, an amendment to the CEFP is not necessary. We will be going to the SBA in the spring of 2022, to request funding for a new roof at Marlinton Elementary School. The sprinkler system will be funded by the savings from the LED lighting project with Wendel.

First home football game against Tucker County is August 27, 2021.

Kyle Wayne, Student Representative, will be present at the next Board Meeting, August 31, 2021.

Mr. Hall updated the Board with the sewer system at the high school. He reassured it will be operational by the time school starts. Rose's Excavating is completing the project though it was difficult locating parts.

Lighting project is underway. They start on the outside and then move inside. Lights will be mounted when children are not in classrooms. Marlinton Elementary School receives LED lighting first and then the high school. Other schools will follow suit.

Mr. Gibson mentioned parent volunteers that fixed the bench, footpath, and bridge at Pocahontas County High School. Matthew Taylor, Adam Taylor, Dewey McCarty, Travis Workman, Greg Cochran, Jeremy Kloeker, Dominion Power, Appalachian Aggregates donated time, equipment and materials to complete the project—what a community effort!

### **INFORMATIONAL REPORTS/CENTRAL OFFICE UPDATES...**

- a. J. L. Clifton, Air Conditioning at Marlinton Elementary School, thanked members Board for giving him an opportunity to be placed on the agenda. Representing Marlinton Elementary School LSIC, Mr. Clifton addressed three points (1) changing his agenda title, (2) the need for an adequate excessive heat policy, and (3) trackable plan for air conditioning at Marlinton Elementary School with transparency reports.

Mr. Clifton articulated policy 5205, the Excessive Heat Policy, being antiquated, stating it does little to address excessive heat and the dates specified in policy are irrelevant to our current school calendar. He provided the Board with an updated sample that could be put into place until additional time is devoted to creating a more efficient excessive heat policy relevant to Pocahontas County Schools. Dr. Hollandsworth reminded Mr. Clifton that the current policy allows for the superintendent to intercede at any time should it deem necessary.

- b. Ruth Bland, Emergency Substitute Bus Drivers—Mrs. Bland addressed the Board concerning emergency substitute school bus drivers, a service category not represented in state code that has both service and professionals performing emergency driving duties when regular substitute bus drivers are not available. Years of service are calculated into the wage rates for service employees but not for the professional employees. Professional emergency substitute school bus drivers have asked that their years of driving experience be included in their wage rates. Though Mrs. Bland does not need Board approval, she does want the Board to be aware of the action and the discussions she will be having with the bus drivers.

**APPROVAL TO AUTHORIZE PAYMENT OF VENDOR LISTING...**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board unanimously approved to authorize payment of vendor listing of claims in the amount of **\$94,695.64.**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. McLaughlin, seconded by Mr. Burns, the Board unanimously approved to authorize payment of vendor listing of claims (Local Government Purchasing Card) in the amount of **\$6,650.70.**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board unanimously approved the Bank Reconciliation for the month of June 2021.

**APPROVAL OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION EXCLUSION...**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board unanimously approved for Board Members to be excluded from workers' compensation coverage on Pocahontas County Board of Education's workers' compensation policy.

**APPROVAL TO PLACE EXCESSIVE HEAT POLICY ON PUBLIC COMMENT...**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board unanimously approved to place policy po5205, EXCESSIVE HEAT IN SCHOOLS, on a 30-day public comment period for the purpose of greater community awareness.

**RE-ENTRY PLAN...**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board entered a discussion on the Review of Re-Entry Plan. Mr. Beam addressed the Board with a handout explaining the preliminary mask-mandate guidelines as designed in the Re-Entry Plan Draft.

After extensive discussion, weighing all options, including recommendations from the audience and Zoom participants, the Board made an alternate motion concerning the Re-Entry Plan Draft.

Mr. McLaughlin made the motion for the Re-Entry Plan to allow optional/ free choice on the wearing of masks for the 2021-2022 school year until otherwise directed by the Governor or our local health department officials. Masks must be worn on school buses in order to regulate the social distancing guidelines. Additionally, Virtual School will be offered to elementary students K-5 grades. Mr. McComb seconded the motion. The Board accepted the Re-Entry Plan at a 4-1 vote, with Mr. Gibson casting the only descending vote.

**APPROVAL OF WENDEL AS ARCHITECT FOR ESCO...**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board unanimously approved to accept Wendel as the architect for the Energy Savings Company (ESCO) to implement the Energy Savings Project for the HVAC System Improvement Project using the American Rescue Plan for Green Bank Elementary-Middle School and Marlinton Middle School.

**APPROVAL OF COMMUNITY CARE OF WEST VIRGINIA, INC. MOU...**

On the recommendation of the superintendent and motion of Mr. Burns, seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, the Board unanimously approved the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Pocahontas County Board of Education and Community Care of West Virginia, Inc., to provide healthcare services in the School Based Health Care Center facilities at Green Bank Elementary-Middle School, Marlinton Elementary School, Marlinton Middle School, and Pocahontas County High School for the 2021-2022 school year.
